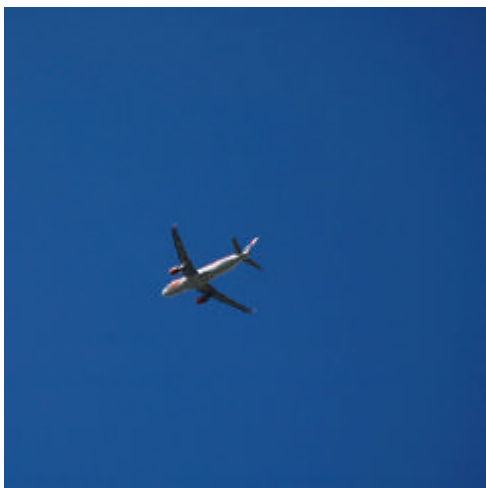
Flights for UK Bound Visitors

Sissinghurst Castle Garden

This 6 acre garden is intimate thanks to its “outdoor rooms” with hedges of rose, yew and hornbeam. Beautiful views of the garden can be enjoyed from the four-storey Elizabethan tower, complete with ancient moat and spiral staircase. The rose garden, for which Sissinghurst is best known, is planted with several old-fashioned species and is complimented beautifully by the White Garden.

Hidcote Manor Garden

Created in the Arts and Crafts style Hidcote Manor Garden features old roses, unusual plants and trees from around the world, including rare plants from Africa and China. Hidcote gardens cover 10.5 acres that centers around the garden gazebo. Another notable feature is the large circular pool, edged with white roses. You can even enjoy a game of tennis or croquet!
